News from the Governors

The new academic year is well underway – a warm welcome to all new families who have recently joined us. Calcot is a very community orientated school, warm and friendly and I'm sure staff and other parents have made you feel welcome.

Governors have already held our first full governing board meeting (FGB), as well as a strategy group meeting to focus on Ofsted – Calcot is expecting inspections this term.

At our FGB in September we saw some changes to the governing body leadership. Mark Hazelton our Chair of Governors for the last 3 years stepped down, Joe Lally and myself were elected as Joint Chair of Governors. Being Joint Chairs enables us to share the responsibility of leading governance and uses the strengths we both bring to the role. Both Joe and I have been involved in education for 30+ years, Joe specialising in Special Needs and Curriculum, I have wide experience in overall school management and finance). Thank you Mark for all your hard work, your leadership over the last 3 years has been invaluable. I am very pleased that Mark has agreed to remain as a governor at our school and has moved from being Parent Governor to Co-opted Governor.

Andrew Marsh, Local Authority governor, has stepped down after many years of governorship at our school (2001). Thank you Andrew for all your years of being part of our school's governing body, his careful eye on the school's finances has led us through some particularly difficult times. Like all schools we are facing massive increases in costs with no increase to our budgets. Through careful planning and monitoring we are in a reasonable state financially.

We have three vacancies on our governing body and we ask all parents to give serious thought to becoming a governor at our school. Perhaps you know of a family member (grandparents, aunts, uncles, or friends) who you feel would make a good governor; we have roles on our Board as a Co-opted Governor. No matter what your background and experience, everyone has something they can contribute. What is essential is that you have enthusiasm and commitment to making sure children at our school get the best possible start in life through their education.
