<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Provide a balanced and carefully planned curriculum which meets the needs of your individual child ● Ensure, to the best of our ability, that your child achieves his/her full potential as a valued member of the school community ● Ensure your child's physical and social well-being at all times and to foster feelings of confidence, self-worth and belonging ● To actively welcome parents/carers into the life of the school ● Provide regular and appropriate homework and give regular feedback on your child's work to enable them to make further progress. ● Keep you informed about general school matters and your child's progress, in particular by providing regular data reports. ● Provide a range of after school and lunchtime extra-curricular activities designed to enrich your child's experience ● Ensure that all teaching staff keep up to date on important educational developments and initiatives which might affect your child ● Monitor the attendance and punctuality of pupils and inform parents as early as possible of concerns. ● Celebrate achievements (both in and outside of school), attitudes to learning and to the school community which embraces our positive school ethos. ● Educate the children about keeping themselves and others safe and healthy. ● Educate the children in the safe and proper use of ICT and the internet (including social media) ● Work with all parties to create a school community where violence, discrimination, abusive behaviour, extremism and bullying of any sort are not tolerated, and where there is a culture of mutual respect. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Ensure that my child attends school on time every day, is collected promptly at the end of the day and that absences are properly notified ● Make the school aware of any concerns or problems that might affect my child's work or behaviour ● Support my child with their homework and wherever possible working independently, promoting opportunities for home learning ● Support the school's policies and guidelines on behaviour and equal opportunities ● Ensure that my child goes to bed at a reasonable time on weekdays and Sunday evenings (Recommended time 9-11 hours sleep for Primary aged children) ● Support the school by attending events including parents' evenings and other discussions about our child's progress ● Ensure that my child wears the correct school uniform and takes pride in their appearance ● Ensure that as Parents/Carers we always model excellent behaviour on and around the school grounds ● Ensure that we don't enter into any inappropriate use of social network sites and use the agreed lines of communication with the school. ● Ensure my child uses ICT, the internet and social media properly, showing respect in their communication with others. ● Act as a positive 'digital role model' ● Make sure that the school has up to date information about my child's medical conditions and parental contact telephone numbers. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Follow the 3Rs by being Ready, Responsible and Respectful ● Always work hard, show determination and a positive attitude to learning and homework ● Attend school regularly and arrive on time each day ● Take pride in my appearance by wearing school uniform correctly ● Respect the learning of others by not disrupting lessons in any way ● Always act respectfully, kindly and supportively to children and adults in our school and our community ● Help to look after the school by keeping it tidy and taking care of the environment and equipment at all times ● Respect classroom and playground rules ● Use ICT and the Internet responsibly ● Use social media sites responsibly, showing respect in all communication with others. ● Cooperate with others during work and play. ● Tell an adult if there is something I am not happy with including any bullying or aggressive behaviour as soon as it is seen or experienced. ● Do my homework regularly and return it to my class teacher ● Read every day at home
