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
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
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
Infant School Update

Nursery

This week's focus story has been 'Kitchen Disco' by <u>Clare Foges</u>. There have been some activities the children enjoyed that focussed on fruits, such as making a citrus soup. We have enjoyed smelling and then squeezing the citrus fruits.







We also mixed flour with water and like magic, Mrs Wilson made it into dough, it felt soft and silky. Some of the children made pizzas with the dough, others made cakes and then put candles on them. It was interesting to stretch the dough and see how far it could be pulled before it broke.





The beads that we put in the water tray grew, some were bigger than others. The colours were very pretty. The children caught them in a sieve, then put them in the blue chute, watched them roll down the chute and tried to catch them in the sieve again. This has been a fun, popular, calming activity.

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Reception

This week we have continued our learning about People Who Help us and shared the story 'All through the night'. We talked about people that work through the night including cleaners, security guards, delivery drivers, news reporters, bakers, midwives, paramedics and many more! In Maths, we have learned about numbers 9 and 10 and we have been singing some rhymes about 1 more and 1 less. The children have done really well with using the vocabulary parts and whole.

Costume lists have already been sent out, please ensure all costumes come into school on Monday 18th March 2024 in a named bag.




Year 1

Year 2

In Year 2 this week, we have been completing our Hot Writes about Christopher's Caterpillars; retelling the story using coordinating conjunctions, expanded noun phrases and our -ed suffix to write in the past tense. We also started our new book, "Lubna's Pebble" and we have predicted what we think will happen next in our story. Everyone worked so hard in all our assessments this week and we are really proud of all the Year 2 pupils.







In Geography, we were learning about why tourism is important in Kenya, and in Science we continued looking at life cycles and learned all about metamorphosis.





Our History, was a real highlight this week as we were learning about the different jobs children had in the Victorian times. We talked about some of the jobs we help with at home like tidying and cleaning our bedrooms, helping to lay the table and clearing the plates. 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Year 4

We started the week by looking at the results of our egg experiment. The children were surprised by the effects the different liquids had on the eggs. They were able to understand and explain why this may have happened and also what we need to do to take care of our teeth. We then looked back at our predictions and discussed whether they were correct and if there were any improvements we could have made to our experiment.

The children have been incredibly resilient this week during our assessments. We are really proud of them for working so hard and giving everything their best try!

This week, some of the children from Year 4 took part in a cross-country event at Newbury Showground. It was safe to say that the run was challenging, considering the rain and mud! The children were all great representatives and despite being covered in mud by the end, their spirits were definitely not dampened.



Year 5

Year 5 have, yet again, had a busy and productive week. It has been assessment week and the students have tried their absolute best; we are very proud of them. Their Hot Write writing pieces were very interesting and a great read. They based their writing on a film about a futuristic era. The children used their knowledge of various literary devices to complete excellent descriptions and narratives.

The children have enjoyed learning about processed and unprocessed foods in DT- debating on the advantages and disadvantages of processed foods. It was a very interesting discussion!

In Art, with Mrs Bellanti, the children studied African art and produced some wonderful pieces, using oil pastels.

Not only did all of the children thoroughly enjoy this, following recipes is also excellent for their reading skills and understanding how to follow instructions. This life skill can be applied in an array of contexts.

In Maths this week, the children have been diligently applying themselves to grasp the concepts of statistics and data analysis. Analysing data sets, identifying patterns and drawing information from data is a crucial life skill, and we would like to praise the children for showing such resilience when they have found this challenging. In Literacy, we were amazed by the children's descriptive and figurative language within their pieces on tempestuous storms, and have produced a terrific piece of extended writing this week.

Please remind the children to complete their homework over the weekend. Overall, we have had great engagement and can already see the benefit of this in their lessons. Homework really supports children's learning and helps to prepare them for their secondary education. We would like to ask that, if the children are struggling to complete their homework for any reason, that your child/children make their teacher aware. They are always more than happy to support with this.

Finally, we would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the children and remind them of how proud we are of all of them. With the completion of their D.T. project and constantly working hard in Literacy and Maths, the children have also had school assessments this week, which they have completed with resilience and an excellent attitude.
