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
Infant School Update

With all the colds this term, Nursery has run out of tissues. Please can you provide a box of tissues for us to use for the children. Thank you.



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
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
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Reception

Last week, we enjoyed sharing the story "Oliver's Vegetables" and learning about different fruits and vegetables. We learned some fascinating facts including the potato was the first vegetable grown in space and strawberries and grapes can come in many colours! In Maths, we began to look at number bonds for 9 and 10 and enjoyed exploring the different compositions using a variety of resources. In PE, we continued to practise running at speed and manoeuvring around objects. The children have done well with changing speed and direction as they run.

- If your child attends our Monday morning phonics club, this will no longer be taking place. After the spring holiday we will be completing these during school hours.



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
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Year 2






In Maths, we were looking at fractions, learning about numerators and denominators and what makes a unit fraction and non-unit frac-

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Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been learning how to write poetry! We have been looking carefully at rhyme and meter and identifying these within a poem to ensure that it has flow. The children spent time reading a variety of poems, including Haikus and rhyming poems. They were able to identify their likes and dislikes about these poems and pick out interesting adjectives that had been used to create an image in the reader's mind.

We then had a go at writing our own clerihew poems which the children really enjoyed! They took inspiration from their own names and had a go at writing some of their own. Here are some examples of our great clerihews.

Year 5

The children enjoyed creating different characters, settings and modes of transport for the Highwayman and Bess! We have spent the week learning about equivalent fractions and decimals, and the children have flown through the many challenges within lessons. They have shown great resilience and effort in lessons. In DT, we continued our topic of Food and Nutrition, working towards creating our own soup. We had great fun soup tasting, where the children tried different soups- some tasty, some not so tasty! Their faces said it all!













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Year 6

Year 6 have had a really good week again. They are working really hard to progress in all areas of the curriculum. We have been looking at continuous and closed data through dual bar graphs, line graphs and pie charts. In addition to this, we have looked at timetables - this will help them when they get their secondary school timetables! In Literacy, we have been doing non-chronological reports on Japan- the children have learnt a lot about the Japanese culture and diet.
