

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Infant School Update

Nursery

The story focus for this week has been 'Jasper's Beanstalk' by Nick Butterworth and Mick Inkpen. We have been learning about planting seeds and growing. Seeds need water, light, warmth, air and time, Jasper found it hard to wait for his bean seed to grow, the adults wonder if the children will feel the same. There have been lots of planting opportunities, exploring soil and creating our own Jasper stories in the small world area. We have used our fine motor skills to thread objects onto a piece of doweling to make our own beanstalk, if we didn't hold the bottom, our beanstalk would topple over, it was a tricky but fun activity.



Reception


This week we have continued with our life cycle theme by sharing the well loved story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' which describes the lifecycle of a butterfly. We have learnt how caterpillars completely change as an adult compared to humans and learnt to say the word 'metamorphosis' to describe these amazing changes in animals. In Maths, we have begun to look at counting patterns beyond ten and looking at a range of different representations and using practical resources to help support the children with their 1 to 1 counting and matching them to different quantities. The children have been keen to explore how BeeBots work and programming them to follow instructions using the vocabulary FORWARD, BACKWARDS, TURN LEFT, TURN RIGHT, GO. The outcome wasn't always the one they wanted but we used this to discuss how instructions need to be clear!






Year 1

This week in Literacy, Year 1 has continued using the book "Peace at Last" to support their learning. We have been exploring root words and the suffix -ing. It has been fantastic listening to the children innovating the story by coming up with their own objects and verbs to replace the ones in the book that keep Mr Bear awake. We have had tummy's rumbling, mummy yawning, baby pretending, dogs barking and even a microwave buzzing.



Maths has been a lot of fun this week too. We have been using a variety of resources to help us understand how we can half and quarter different amounts. We know that to find a half, we need to split our whole number into 2 equal groups and to find a quarter we split our whole number into 4 equal groups. We had lots of different maths stories to help us explore our learning further. If you have any small items like raisins or pasta at home, we are sure the children would love to show off their learning.



Sophie has 8 colouring pencils and she wants to share them out with 3 of her friends. How many children are there altogether?

Reminders

At the end of each day, we spend a lot of time trying to find the owner of jumpers/cardigans. Can we please ask that you name all your children's school items (bags, bottles, lunch boxes, clothing including PE kit).





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Year 2

This week, we have been learning to write the perfect postcard. We pretended that Lubna had moved to Calcot and we wrote a postcard to Amir. We also used subordinating conjunctions to add more information to our postcards and we used the school editing codes to correct and up-level our work.

Please remember to send in a self-addressed and stamped envelope for your child so we can post them.

In Maths, we have been using the more than(>) and less than(<) symbols to apply to measurement whilst we have been working in metres and centimetres. We were also ordering different objects from tallest to shortest and vice versa. We have also been working on consolidating our place value knowledge, looking at how seven tens are the same as 70, and partitioning two digit numbers (for example: 58 is made up of 50 or five tens, and 8 ones).

In Geography, we were learning about the seven cities in Scotland and we used the atlas to help us label them. We also learned about some Scottish landmarks and traditions, and we learned about how a true Scotsman wears his kilt!





Our History this week was about the history of Reading Abbey - it was fascinating to learn that it was destroyed by King Henry VIII. We compared it to Westminster Abbey and did a virtual tour around it which was really awe inspiring. We looked back at important historical events which had taken place there such as the coronation of Queen Elizabeth and King Charles, and the royal wedding of Prince William and Catherine Middleton.





Junior School Update

Year 3

We were so proud of the children on Wednesday when they had their first swimming lesson. They were fantastic during the lesson and thoroughly enjoyed every minute of swimming time. Please remember that no jewellery is to be worn on swimming days, and the children must come in to school in their P.E. kits and not their school uniform on Wednesdays.

The children were very excited for their first recorder lesson this week. All of their hard work learning notes and rests earlier in the year helped them play their first tunes. With lots of practice the children will do extremely well.

Blow softly to avoid squeaking!


Cover the holes carefully


Use their tongue to separate the notes

They have been focusing on fronted adverbials and adjectives to add detail to their writing. We also explored whether gas has mass in Science and had great fun acting scientifically while we discovered it does indeed have mass! The children were fantastic in their first swimming lesson on Monday. For the next two weeks, our swimming day will move to Fridays so please ensure swimming kit is brought in on Fridays. Next Thursday, the children will participate in a Romans Day where they are encouraged to dress up in Ancient Rome attire; we are very excited for this and cannot wait to share photos next week.








Year 5

Year 5 have had a really exciting week. The children especially enjoyed their trip to Reading Train Station, where they were able to learn about the history of the station, the architecture, as well as travel by train to Didcot and learn how trains are run. Some children even got to go in the Driver's cab! We are very grateful to GWR for a fully funded trip and the opportunity to take part in Look, Draw, Build, which is a competition run for approximately 9 schools in Reading, for the children to design and make their stations. So far, the children have named their stations and created a logo for them.

The children have also enjoyed learning how to use a protractor and creating their own shapes, measuring angles and lines.

They have also continued with their study of "The Boy in the Tower", the children wrote some very informative and detailed non-chronological reports. We were very impressed by their knowledge, use of formal tone, and layout understanding.















Year 6

We have had yet another superb week in Year 6; well done children, keep it up!

The Year 6 children have shown remarkable resilience and unwavering determination in their endeavours, and we couldn't be prouder. Their commitment to their studies and their positive attitude towards challenges have been truly inspiring.
