We explored a range of habitats and discussed why they are suitable for the animals that live there. The children were curious, thoughtful, and made brilliant links to their classroom learning.

In History and Literacy, we have been learning all about the Gunpowder Plot – and wow, the children have an incredible amount of knowledge! They used their historical understanding to write fantastic recounts as if they were Guy Fawkes carrying out the plot. Their writing included some fabulous vocabulary, conjunctions, and expanded noun phrases, and we are so proud of the effort they put into their work.

Junior School Update

Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic Autumn Term, filled with enthusiasm, creativity and hard work. In English, the children produced wonderful writing linked to our class text "*Stone Age Boy*". Through detailed planning and a strong understanding of ambitious vocabulary and varied sentence structures, they wrote vivid setting descriptions of a cave. After publishing their work, the children used a computer programme to generate images based on their descriptions, allowing them to see the power of their words.

This term in Maths, Year 3 have explored a wide range of measurement skills through practical, hands-on learning. They have practised using rulers and metre sticks accurately, compared and ordered lengths, and applied their knowledge to real-life problems by estimating and measuring. Later in the term, the children moved on to learning about volume and capacity. They enjoyed experimenting with different containers, reading scales, comparing intervals and exploring how much liquid various containers could hold. It has been a fantastic term full of reasoning, problem solving and growing independence in mathematical thinking.

The children have enjoyed our learning in Art this term, and they were very keen to create secondary colours from the primary colours. They created warm and cold colours as well as complementary colours and explored artists and their paintings to see how these have been used. Continuing in this creative vein, the children enjoyed watching the Year 5 production and it gave them a helpful insight into the performance that they will be part of in the Spring Term. More details to follow in the new term.

The final festive week of this term was full of joy and creativity. The children proudly published their Hot Writes, showing just how much progress they have made in presentation, handwriting and writer's craft. We all enjoyed the Christmas lunch, festive jumpers and a very successful Movie Night. The children also loved a week of crafting; creating peg reindeer, Christmas/Winter cards, festive ornaments, pretend fossils and Snowman calendars.

The Year 3 Team would like to thank all parents and carers for their continued support and wish you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. We hope you enjoy a restful break and look forward to seeing everyone again in 2026.
