## **Reminder - Year 4 MTC Meeting**

In June 2022 the government introduced a statutory assessment for all year 4 pupils across the country, in order to assess them on their times tables. The purpose of the Multiplication Check (MTC) is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently up to 12x12- an essential skill for future success in mathematics. Don't forget Year 4 will be holding an information meeting after school on **Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> March**. Session 1 will take place in 4AM at 3.25pm and sessions 2 is online at 5pm, a link will be sent out for this.

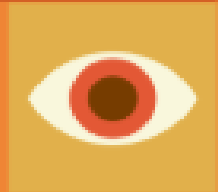

## Nursery

We have had a lovely month in the nursery filled with fun, laughter, learning, and of course, lots of play! We've had to embrace the great British weather as it has been a very wet month. While some children were a little unsure about being out in the rain, with lots of encouragement and praise, they have really enjoyed spending time outdoors—fresh air is so good for their wellbeing and immune systems.

The children are thriving with our free-flow timetable and are confidently choosing where they would like to play. We've seen many more children exploring the outdoor environment, especially our courtyard, where exciting messy play opportunities have been available thanks to the kind donations we have received—thank you again to everyone who contributed! Some of our most popular activities have been cornflour, shaving foam, coloured water, rice, and playdough made from the donated ingredients. Mrs Dent kindly visited the scrapstore and collected some wonderful treasures for our indoor and outdoor areas. The children have loved using cable reels and planks outside, turning them into skateboards, cars, and all sorts of imaginative creations. Indoors, our new loose-parts area has been very popular. The children have been exploring and building with different resources—using long cardboard tubes as marble ramps, tins to build skyscrapers, and pots and lids for sorting and imaginative play.

We ended the term with lots of Valentine's-themed activities, which we hope you've enjoyed seeing on Tapestry. We are always looking for ways to enhance our environment and activities, and your donations make such a positive difference for your children's learning—thank you for your continued support. We hope all our families had a wonderful half-term break!

## Reception

Ahoy me hearties! This month we had great fun learning all about pirates. The children created treasure maps and worked together to hunt for gold, showing fantastic teamwork. In PE, we played the game "Captain's Coming", walked the plank and avoided the sharks! We practised our reading skills by sorting words into "trash or treasure" and sang sea shanties.

We also enjoyed learning about Lunar New Year. We read the story of "The Great Race" and discovered which animals represent different birth years. The children explored noodles outdoors, tried Chinese writing, role-played in our Chinese takeaway, and made colourful lanterns in the creative area. The children also enjoyed creating kindness potions.

In Maths, we have continued exploring the composition of numbers 6, 7 and 8 using the language of "part" and "whole", including ladybird spot patterns. We have also introduced odd and even numbers, learning that even numbers can always be paired equally, and we have also been learning how to double numbers.

We had a fantastic time at Don Rae's dance and drama workshop, especially parading with the dragon and performing with ribbons and dancing to "Kung Fu Fighting" for our families.

## Year 1

Year 1 have had a fantastic end to the half term! The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning the songs for our brand-new song play, “The Enormous Turnip”, and their enthusiasm has been wonderful to see. We have also completed our learning about Madagascar, finishing with the children creating their own rainforest habitats. They explored which animals live in the rainforest and why the climate is so hot, even locating the equator and learning why it is much warmer in Madagascar than here in the UK.

In Literacy, we have begun learning about instructional writing. The children have been exploring verbs as action words and understanding that every sentence needs a verb to make sense. We’ve had great fun acting out different verbs to bring our learning to life — lots of energy and laughter all around!

Year 2 had a fantastic time on our school trip to Reading Abbey and Reading Museum. It was so special to bring all of their history learning to life by walking through the abbey ruins and seeing the artefacts up close in the museum.

The children were exceptionally well behaved and represented the school brilliantly. We were so proud of them! It was lovely to see how engaged they were — asking thoughtful questions, making connections to their learning and showing genuine curiosity throughout the day.

## Junior School Update

### Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic month and we are so proud of them! They have been working incredibly hard in Maths, mastering column addition with 3-digit numbers and learning how to exchange confidently. The children have shown great determination and resilience, and their progress has been wonderful to see. We are now looking forward to starting subtraction next!

Year 3 also had an amazing time on their trip to London. They thoroughly enjoyed visiting the Natural History Museum and were thrilled to see The Lion King – what a special treat! The children were fantastic role models for our school throughout the trip, and all of the teachers were extremely proud of their excellent behaviour and enthusiasm.

In addition, the children did an excellent job making their own garden salads. They made sure to be very hygienic and handled the knives safely and sensibly. They loved tucking into their delicious salads afterwards – a wonderful way to practise their food preparation skills!

### Year 4

Year 4 have continued to work incredibly hard and it has been lovely to see their confidence growing across the curriculum. At the end of last term, the children completed their retelling of 'Perseus and Medusa', focusing on using fronted adverbials to build tension and guide the reader through the action. We were so proud of the creativity and resilience they showed, and it was wonderful to see them applying their grammar skills so confidently.

We have now begun our new English text, 'The Butterfly Lion'. Our current focus is on writing consistently in the correct tense, helping the children to develop greater accuracy and control in their work, alongside exploring character emotions and themes. In Maths, we have just started our fractions unit and are building our understanding of what fractions represent and how they can be shown in different ways. We are also continuing to practise times tables regularly as we prepare for the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). Thank you for supporting your children with Times Tables Rock Stars at home.

We ended last term with a fantastic trip to Cotswold Wildlife Park. Despite the rain, the children were brilliant and fully embraced the experience, taking part in a habitats workshop that linked perfectly to our Science learning. Making bread rolls in DT was another highlight. The children loved getting hands-on and were very proud of their creations.

## Year 5

Year 5 have been working incredibly hard this term, as usual, and we are so proud of their efforts and enthusiasm across all areas of the curriculum.

In English, the children have absolutely loved continuing their study of *'The Highwayman'*. They have particularly enjoyed writing letters to the King's men from the perspective of Tim, the stable boy. The children fully immersed themselves in the character, carefully considering how Tim would write, the emotions he would be feeling and the details he would choose to include. They considered the layout and structure of a letter, thoughtfully ensuring their writing was both engaging and authentic to the character. It has been wonderful to see their creativity and empathy shine through in their work.

In Maths, the children have been developing their understanding of how to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1,000, applying this knowledge to real-life contexts, particularly when working with measurements. They have shown great determination in mastering these skills and have grown in confidence when explaining their reasoning.

Science has been an exciting and hands-on subject this term, as the children have been exploring forces. They designed and created their own parachutes to investigate air resistance, tested friction using different surfaces and toy cars, and even built their own pulleys and levers. The children thoroughly enjoyed carrying out practical investigations and thinking scientifically about their results.

In PE, Year 5 have been enjoying yoga. They have learned a range of different poses and worked collaboratively to create their own sequences. It has been fantastic to see their balance, flexibility and teamwork developing, as well as the calm focus they bring to each session.

It truly has been a great term. Thank you to the children for their continued hard work and enthusiasm, and thank you to parents for your ongoing support.

## Year 6

Year 6 have continued to impress us with their maturity, resilience and growing determination. They approach their learning with genuine curiosity and have shown a thoughtful attitude across all areas of school life.

In History, the children have been learning about World War I and World War II. They were particularly fascinated by the topic of rationing, especially discovering that people were limited to just one egg a week or one new outfit a year! They were amazed to learn that rationing lasted for 14 years. Their thoughtful discussions have shown how much they are developing their historical understanding and empathy.

A real highlight this term was our trip to London, where the children visited the Houses of Parliament and the Imperial War Museum. Their behaviour throughout the day was exemplary and we received many compliments from both museum and parliamentary staff. At the museum, the children asked insightful and pertinent questions about wartime shelters, aeroplanes and life in the trenches, gaining a powerful understanding of what it was like during WWII.

The opportunity to meet a real-life Lord, Lord Russell of Liverpool, was particularly memorable. The children observed a debate in the House of Lords regarding social media restrictions for under-16s and had the chance to ask thoughtful questions about how democracy and government work. It was an inspiring and valuable experience.

We also enjoyed a fantastic morning taking part and watching Calcot's Got Talent. From steel pans and magic tricks to singing, football skills, gymnastics, drawing, jokes and dancing, the variety of performances was wonderful. It was lovely to see so many children confidently auditioning and showcasing their talents and interests. The enthusiasm and support shown for one another was a real highlight.

Overall, it has been another busy and enriching month in Year 6. The children continue to demonstrate curiosity, confidence and resilience in all they do. Thank you, as always, for your continued support.
