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Nursery

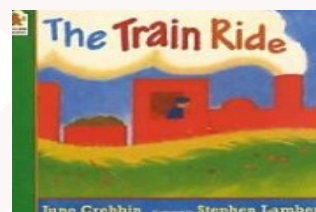
What a fantastic month we have had in Nursery! The children have enjoyed a wide range of exciting activities, making the most of both our indoor and outdoor environments. Our mud kitchen has been full of imaginative play, with children creating potions, petal soups, mud cakes and tea parties using natural resources. In the sand pit, we have built volcanoes, moats and roads, exploring how water moves through channels. Creative activities such as vegetable printing, painting, chalking and making crowns have encouraged self-expression and fine motor development.

The children have loved role-playing as mums, dads, mechanics, shopkeepers and firefighters, while construction areas have inspired them to build towers, ramps and small worlds. We have also enjoyed Forest School adventures, exploring the meadow, allotment and polytunnel, tasting home-grown produce and learning about nature. Sports Week, yoga, dance, rugby, cricket and gymnastics sessions have helped us develop confidence, coordination and teamwork skills.



Reception

This term our topic has been all about 'Journeys'. We shared 'Martha Maps It Out' and talked about the many journeys we make, both near and far. In Literacy, we also read 'Daddy's Sandwich!' and the children loved discussing what they would put in their sandwiches and what they love about their dad. We also shared the story 'The Train Ride' and used repeated language to discuss what we see when travelling. The children showed imagination, turning tyres and crates into cars, buses and trains. We enjoyed our school trip to Rushall Farm. The children loved the tractor ride, met farm animals, learnt about bees and wheat, and created colour palettes in the woodland. It was a wonderful day and they represented the school brilliantly.



In Maths, we have explored sharing and grouping, equal and unequal groups, odd and even numbers, doubling facts and repeating patterns. We also developed positional language through a barrier game and enjoyed cooling off in the paddling pool, taking part in Cosmic Yoga and visiting our new Year 1 classes. Although some children were nervous, they returned beaming with smiles.

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Year 1

What a wonderful few weeks it has been in Year 1! All of the children have worked incredibly hard with their phonics and have now completed their phonics screening checks. We are so proud of the positive attitude they showed throughout the process and the effort they put into their learning. It has been fantastic to see their confidence grow and to celebrate all of their hard work.

You will find out whether your child has met the expected standard in their end-of-year report, once the final pass mark has been released by the government.

The children also thoroughly enjoyed their transition visit to Year 2, where they had the opportunity to meet their new teachers and explore their new classrooms. They are already looking forward to their next visit.

In English, we have continued our learning about the 'Great Fire of London'. The children wrote thoughtful recounts describing what they saw and how they felt before creating their own non-fiction pages to showcase everything they have learned. They have become true Great Fire of London experts!

In History, we have begun learning about castles. The children especially enjoyed working together to design and build a castle to protect the Queen from an attack. Through this exciting challenge, they discovered why castles were often built on hills to spot approaching attackers and learned about features such as arrow slits, which helped to keep the monarch safe.

We are looking forward to continuing our learning about castles over the coming weeks.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a fantastic month filled with exciting experiences and wonderful learning opportunities!

We were incredibly lucky to welcome Jungle Jonathon to school, who brought along a fascinating collection of animals for us to meet. This memorable visit has inspired our non-fiction writing, and the children have worked exceptionally hard to write engaging facts about a royal python, a pink-toed Peruvian tarantula, and a tailless whip scorpion. We have been focusing on using a range of sentence types to make our writing informative and interesting. The highlight for many of us was having the opportunity to touch and even hold some of the animals!

We also had a wonderful time visiting the Junior School for our transition day. It was lovely to see so many familiar faces, and the children thoroughly enjoyed exploring their new surroundings and meeting members of the Year 3 team. We are very proud of how confidently and enthusiastically they embraced this exciting step.

Our recent trip to Legoland was another huge success! The children had an amazing day taking part in the 'All Around the World' workshop in Lego City, where they learnt about different countries and cultures through creative building activities. There was also plenty of excitement as we enjoyed many of the rides and attractions throughout the park. The children's behaviour was excellent, and they were fantastic ambassadors for the school.

Finally, a reminder that our Year 2 production, 'The Litter Muncher', will be performed on **1st July**. The children have been working incredibly hard during rehearsals and are having so much fun preparing for the show. It has been wonderful to see so many of them stepping out of their comfort zones, growing in confidence, and showcasing their talents.

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Junior School Update

Year 3

The Year 3 children have thoroughly enjoyed their English learning this term. The children have immersed themselves in Chapter 3: The Shooting, from our class text 'Fantastic Mr Fox'. As part of their writing, the children planned and wrote a retelling of the chapter, using adverbs, prepositions and conjunctions to express time, place and cause. They also used this opportunity to use direct speech in a conversation to move the story forward. The teachers have been incredibly impressed with the children's enthusiasm, creativity and the high standard of writing they have produced, particularly their use of ambitious vocabulary and descriptive language.

In History, the children have continued their learning about the Iron Age and have enjoyed discovering more about the Celts. They have been learning about Celtic settlements and how trade helped communities to exchange goods and resources. The children have shown great interest in exploring how people lived, worked and traded during this period.

We have also been so proud of how sensible, respectful and mature the children have been during our PSHE lessons. The children have been learning about the physical changes that occur as we grow and develop into adults. They have learned new vocabulary, participated thoughtfully in discussions and approached the topic with curiosity and maturity. It has been wonderful to see such positive attitudes towards what we have called the 'great growing up adventure'.

In Geography, the children learned about the Giant's Causeway in Northern Ireland and were fascinated by this remarkable natural landmark. They enjoyed discovering how thousands of interlocking basalt columns were formed and were amazed by the unique patterns found along the coastline. The children were particularly captivated by the legend of the two giants, Finn McCool and Benandonner, who were said to have created the causeway. They thoroughly enjoyed comparing the scientific explanation with the traditional story and asking thoughtful questions about this famous natural wonder.

Mrs Binns has also been very impressed with the children's attitude during their swimming lessons. It has been wonderful to see how much their confidence has grown over recent weeks as they continue to develop this important life skill. The children should be very proud of the progress they have made.

Finally, we have been incredibly proud of the way the children have approached their assessments this week. They have demonstrated excellent resilience and perseverance, tackling each challenge with a positive attitude and always striving to do their very best. Well done, Year 3!

Year 4

This month has been another busy and exciting one in Year 4. We thoroughly enjoyed our visit to Englefield House, where the children showed great enthusiasm despite the wet weather. Throughout the day, they explored a variety of informative displays and interactive demonstrations led by estate staff and local organisations. The children learned about a wide range of topics including health and wellbeing, local history, habitats and wildlife, trees and timber, farming and food production, community life, and the importance of energy and water. It was wonderful to see the children asking thoughtful questions, engaging with experts and making links to their learning back in the classroom.

In Maths, we have been focusing on properties of shape and symmetry. The children have been identifying and



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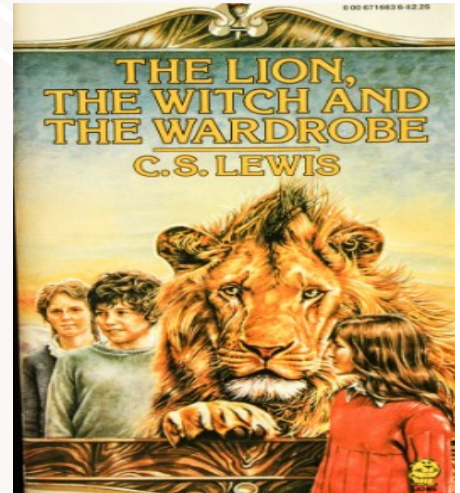
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describing different types of angles, comparing and classifying shapes based on their properties, and exploring lines of symmetry. We have incorporated plenty of practical learning opportunities, allowing the children to investigate shapes through hands-on activities, draw lines of symmetry, and reason about their mathematical thinking. The children have shown increasing confidence when using mathematical vocabulary and explaining their ideas.

In English, we have begun our new class text, 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe' by C. S. Lewis. The children have enjoyed being introduced to the story and meeting the main characters as they begin their adventure. We have been using the text to inspire our reading and writing lessons, with a particular focus on punctuating direct speech accurately. The children have been learning how to use inverted commas, commas and other punctuation correctly when writing dialogue, and have enjoyed creating conversations between characters from the story. We are looking forward to continuing our journey through Narnia and using the text as inspiration for some imaginative writing over the coming weeks.



Year 5

Year 5 have had a wonderful final term, filled with creativity, achievement and memorable experiences.

Throughout the term, in English, we studied poetry by Joseph Coelho and used his work as inspiration for our own writing. Using vivid imagery, powerful vocabulary and carefully chosen language, the children created imaginative poems that evoked strong emotions and painted clear pictures for the reader.

In Mrs Hancock's class, the children wrote fantastic diary entries based on Kensuke's Kingdom. Imagining they had been cast away on a deserted island, they brought their experiences to life through rich descriptions and excellent use of grammar and language.

During Assessment Week, the children worked incredibly hard and achieved some excellent results. As a result of their dedication throughout the year, they have made good progress and should be very proud of their achievements.

Swimming has also been a great success. All children improved their skills, and every child participated enthusiastically and made the most of the experience.

In RSE, we were particularly impressed by the children's maturity. As we discussed important topics about growing up and understanding our bodies, they listened carefully, contributed thoughtfully and asked sensible, informative questions.

Looking ahead, we are all excited about our upcoming trip to Paultons Park, which will be a wonderful way to celebrate a fantastic year. As the year comes to an end, we would like to congratulate all of Year 5 on their hard work, enthusiasm and success. What a great year it has been!
