

Sports Grant Funding

Most schools with primary-age pupils receive the PE and sport premium.

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government has been providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years from 2013/14 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding'. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

Spending the Sports Grant Funding

How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?

The Governors agree that the money must be used in our pursuit of excellence for all children: every child will benefit from additional opportunities; our most able children will be given further opportunities which will enable them to benefit from subject specialist high level coaching; in addition staff will have access to training opportunities and continued professional development.

In 2016-2017 we received £34,233

The following shows how we spent the Sports funding during 2016- 2017.

<u>Activities</u>	<u>Cost</u>	<u>Impact</u>
Supply cover	£2078	Allowing staff to attend courses so that they are able to deliver high quality PE lessons across the school.
Staff Training- Create Development	£2760	All staff in the Infants and Juniors has been full trained in the new PE framework that is being taught across the school. Teachers are able to plan effective lessons and assess the child's progress.
MNR Coaching	£6350	High quality sports provision for children in Years 3 & 6.
Sports Xtra- Coaching	£4932	Exposing children to a wider range of sporting events including boxing and fencing.
Reading FC	£3925	Larger number of boys and girls have had the experience to attend after school clubs, coached by qualified Reading FC coaches. Three children have been invited to attend Reading FC training for their age group because of this coaching.
Sport event transportation	£1020	Children were able to attend sports events including cross country, football and rugby events.
Hampshire County Council- Swimming courses	£880	New staff were trained on how to deliver swimming lessons. There are now a greater number of teachers able to deliver swimming throughout the school meaning the children have more opportunities to swim in the summer term.
Sports week and Carnival	£4133	Specialist dance and sports providers.
Sports Partnership and affiliations	£4374	Allowed the Infant and Junior schools to be part the Schools partnership where we receive 3 x 6 week free coaching blocks for each school, access to a number of organised tournaments, some of which are new to the school and free use of any equipment needed by the school throughout the year. This year the percentage of children competing for the school has increased from last year. Affiliation to a number of tournaments across KS2. Children have been able to represent the school and compete in organised competition.
